Ottawa-area school bus firms quit talks; Stock, First Student want 10-12% raise in rates

This kind of showdown was inevitable. The ministry has been squeezing school boards on transportation funding for years, forcing most school boards to get out of the business of school busing years ago.

The only good that I can think has come out of the province's approach is the formation of multi-board consortia, which eliminated some duplication in the system. But clearly the ministry's approach has had some bad consequences. Small independent operators have been unable to compete with the likes of First Student and Stock, who could low-ball initial bids, absorb the losses for a few years, and now, play hardball now that most of the competition--the smaller independent operators--have been forced out of business.

The association representing independent operators has posted a copy of the letter Stock wrote to the Ottawa Student Transportation Authority, and says the development represents the "chickens coming home to roost" for the province's RFP approach to funding student transportation. http://home.isboa.ca/docs/StockLetterToOSTA-April112014.pdf

This following quote from the letter illustrates everything that is wrong about the province's approach, which has forced out of business independent operators who have much less need to "provide value and security" to investors and banks.

"In addition to the duty that Stock has to the boards, consortia, parents and children that we service, we also have a duty to our investors and financial institutions to provide value and security for their investment."
