
## Welcome to CUPE Local 1479

#### What is CUPE?

- CUPE (The Canadian Union of Public Employees) is Canada's largest union, with 700,000 members across the country. CUPE represents workers in health care, emergency services, education, early learning and childcare, municipalities, social services, libraries, utilities, transportation, airlines and more.
- ▶ We help our members provide the highest level of service by ensuring they are safe and healthy at work, and that they get fair pay and benefits for the services they provide.
- We also advocate for better public services, like improvements to public health care and to the Canada Pension Plan, that would improve our communities and the lives all Canadians.

#### Our Local and the Labour Movement



Each application for membership in the Local shall be directed to the Secretary-Treasurer and shall be accompanied by an initiation fee of \$1.00, which shall be in addition to monthly fees, known as union dues.

The Secretary-Treasurer shall issue a receipt. If the application is rejected, the fee shall be returned.

8.2 The re-admittance fee shall be \$1.00

8.3 The monthly dues shall be 1.80% of regular wages.

What are union dues?

Union dues are monthly contributions members make to the union based on their working status. By paying union dues, members pool their resources to ensure protection of the group as a whole and achieve fair wages and benefits, safe working conditions and representation.

# Why do I pay union dues?

CUPE Local 1479 is made up of three units. Each unit has their own Collective Agreement.

Unit 1

Educational Assistants, Youth Workers, Secretary
 & Clerical, Custodial & Maintenance and IT

Unit 2

 Designated Early Childhood Educators, Instructors

Unit 3

Triboard Transportation (Not employees of ALCDSB)

## The OSBCU – Part A of the Collective Agreement

- ► The Ontario School Board Council of Unions is the central bargaining agent for all CUPE Education Workers in Ontario. This section of the collective agreement includes all financial components of the agreement, including sick leave and benefits. The team is made of members from across the province.
- ▶ All CUPE Education Workers in Ontario have a centrally negotiated Collective Agreement that is the same in every school board with CUPE members in Ontario. This is referred to as *Part A* of the collective agreement.
- ▶ The Ontario School Board Council of Unions (OSBCU) unites 55,000 CUPE education workers in the public, Catholic, English, and French school systems across the province.
- OSBCU allows education workers from across the province to share information and strategies for bargaining, engage in political action, lobby around common interests, and to discuss issues and policies of concern. We are the power of public education, committed to the protection and advancement of our services, our schools, our students, and our communities.

#### Local Bargaining – Part B

The back section of the collective agreement is known as Part B

This section is negotiated locally and directly with our employer, the Algonquin and Lakeshore Catholic District School Board.

It contains the articles that cover scope, seniority, promotions and transfers, local leaves, pay bands and wage grids.

You do not have a complete collective agreement until both sections are voted on and passed with the membership.

The current collective agreement for both Units 1 & 2 expire August 31, 2022

#### When do I call my representative?

- ▶ If you have questions about your collective agreement.
- If you feel the collective agreement has been violated.
- If you have brought a concern to your supervisor/principal and feel that it has not be resoled.
- ▶ If you feel you have a health and safety concern that has not been resolved.
- If you are having a Return to Work meeting through Ability and Wellness.
- If you have been injured at work (no matter how severe).
- If you think our employer has discriminated against you, treated you unfairly, or harassed you because of your race, color, ethnicity or national origin, religion, sex, pregnancy, disability, age, or genetic information.
- If you are called into a discipline meeting with your supervisor/principal contact your union representative immediately.
